No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 55.4

New Brunswick
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 2.3

Newfoundland and Labrador
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 0.4

Prince Edward Island
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 3.1

Nova Scotia
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; exception for residents returning directly from New Brunswick or Prince Edward Island

III Intra-Provincial 1.8

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
