Residents returning from Churchill, MB for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must isolate for 10 days.

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-territory for domestic leisure travel but must file a self-isolation plan within 24 hours of arrival.

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 93.3

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 160.7

Ontario
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 89.7

Quebec
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel. Residents returning to Nunavik or James Bay from out-of-province may be required to self-isolate.

IV Inter-Provincial 112.3

New Brunswick
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 280.9

Newfoundland and Labrador
No self-isolation for fully vaccinated residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial 375.8

Prince Edward Island
No self-isolation for fully vaccinated residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel, following testing procedures.

V Tentative International 917.8

Nova Scotia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

V Tentative International 134.0
