Residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel must isolate for 14 days at government approved sites; exception for residents returning directly from Northwest Territories or Churchill, Manitoba

III Intra-Territorial 96.6

Northwest Territories
Residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; fully vaccinated travellers may get tested on the 8th day for reduced self-isolation

III Intra-Territorial 11.1

Yukon
Residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 9.5

British Columbia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

II Hyper Local 249.0

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

II Hyper Local 150.5

Manitoba
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 104.3

Ontario
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are strongly advised to self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 192.5

Quebec
Residents returning from Ontario for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 91.6

New Brunswick
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 8.1

Newfoundland and Labrador
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 2.9

Prince Edward Island
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 3.1

Nova Scotia
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; exception for residents returning directly from Newfoundland & Labrador or Prince Edward Island

III Intra-Provincial 25.1

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
