Residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel must isolate for 14 days at government approved sites; exception for residents returning directly from Churchill, Manitoba

II Hyper Local 35.6

Northwest Territories
Residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days; fully vaccinated travellers may get tested on the 8th day for reduced self-isolation

III Intra-Territorial 13.3

Yukon
As of May 25, fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel may enter without self-isolating; mandatory 14 day self-isolation for non-vaccinated residents

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

Manitoba
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 238.2

Ontario
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are strongly advised to self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 89.2

Quebec
Residents returning from Ontario for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

II Hyper Local 47.6

New Brunswick
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 8.5

Newfoundland and Labrador
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 11.5

Prince Edward Island
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days

III Intra-Provincial 5.6

Nova Scotia
Residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel must self-isolate for 14 days
