Nunavut
Residents returning from Churchill, MB for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days at designated sites

IV Inter-Provincial 0.0

Northwest Territories
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate, but testing for those arriving in smaller communities; those who are partially vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days and those who are unvaccinated for 10 days

IV Inter-Provincial 77.5

Yukon
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-territory for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 475.6

British Columbia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 52.8

Alberta
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 60.4

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 71.5

Manitoba
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; 14 day self-isolation required for those who are not fully vaccinated

IV Inter-Provincial 78.1

Ontario
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 30.7

Quebec
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel

IV Inter-Provincial 55.2

New Brunswick
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days or until receipt of a negative test result taken on day 10

IV Inter-Provincial 60.8

Newfoundland and Labrador
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days or until receipt of a negative test result taken on day 7 or later

IV Inter-Provincial 1.9

Prince Edward Island
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate if they have a PEI Pass but will be tested at entry; those who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days and follow testing procedures

V Tentative International 11.3

Nova Scotia
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the province for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 7 days and follow testing procedures

IV Inter-Provincial 20.1

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
