Nunavut
Residents returning from Churchill, MB for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those returning from all other parts of Canada who are not fully vaccinated must isolate for 10 days at designated sites.

II Hyper Local **454.9**

Northwest Territories
Fully vaccinated residents returning from outside of the territory for domestic leisure travel are not required to self-isolate; those arriving in smaller communities; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 10 days or until receipt of a negative test on day 8 or later.

IV Inter-Provincial **1,755.9**

Yukon
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-territory for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **275.9**

British Columbia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **146.4**

Alberta
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **209.2**

Saskatchewan
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **n/a**

Manitoba
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **242.2**

Ontario
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **126.6**

Quebec
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel. Residents returning to Nunavik or James Bay from out-of-province may be required to self-isolate.

IV Inter-Provincial **208.6**

New Brunswick
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Inter-Provincial **271.3**

Newfoundland and Labrador
No self-isolation for fully vaccinated residents returning from outside the province for domestic leisure travel, following testing procedures; those not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 14 days or until receipt of a negative test result taken on day 7 or later.

II Hyper Local **309.7**

Prince Edward Island
No self-isolation for fully vaccinated residents returning from outside the province for domestic leisure travel, following testing procedures; those who are not fully vaccinated must self-isolate for 8 days and follow testing procedures.

III Intra-Provincial **927.8**

Nova Scotia
No self-isolation requirements for residents returning from out-of-province for domestic leisure travel.

IV Tentative International **224.9**

Please note: An increase in search and bookings does not imply that residents are non-compliant with any current health restrictions in place, rather that there is an increased interest in travel. Actual travel could take place in the near future or at a later date.
